4. The easiest fire - teaching-night takeaway
5. The wrong fire - next-day reflection
6. Restoration + true friendship - follow-up and discussion

POST 1 - EVENT ANNOUNCEMENT

GRAPHIC: Choose Your Fire main artwork

Who are you standing around - and who are you becoming around them?

POST 2 - GROUP CHAT PROMPT

GRAPHIC: What's in the Group Chat?

Your group chat is more than names on a screen. It is a circle of access.

The voices closest to you can shape what you laugh at, what you normalize, what you hide and who you are becoming. Jesus calls us to love everyone and forgive freely - but that does not mean everyone receives the same influence.

Who is helping you become more like Jesus?

We are talking about it at CHOOSE YOUR FIRE. [DATE / TIME / LOCATION]

POST 3 - EVENT-DAY REMINDER

GRABUG: Which Fire Will You Choose?

Two fires. Two circles. Two outcomes.

One offers acceptance without accountability. The other offers truth, restoration and true friendship.

Tonight we look at Peter's two fires - the courtyard where he denied Jesus and the shore where Jesus restored him.

Which fire will you choose?

POST 4 - TEACHING TAKEAWAY

GRABUG: The Easiest Fire

The easiest fire is often the one where nobody holds you accountable.

Nobody challenges the compromise. Nobody reminds you who God called you to become. Nobody asks whether fitting in is costing you your integrity.

Real friendship does more than make us comfortable. It tells the truth in love and helps lead us toward restoration.

Tag someone who has helped you stay close to Jesus.

POST 5 - PERSONAL REFLECTION

GRAPHIC: The Wrong Fire

We may never say, 'I do not know Jesus,' but our choices can communicate it.

When belonging requires us to hide our faith, join the cruelty, repeat the gossip or break our convictions, we are standing around the wrong fire.

Where are you tempted to become less whole just to fit in? What loving boundary or accountable conversation is your next faithful step?

POST 6 - RESTORATION FOLLOW-UP

GRAPHIC: Truth + Love + Accountability

Peter's failure was not the end of his story.

At the second fire, Jesus did not shame Peter. He fed him, confronted him, restored him and trusted him with purpose again.

That is the kind of community we need: truth without cruelty, love without compromise and accountability that makes room for restoration.

Jesus still invites us away from the wrong fire and back to His table.
